Except where the CDPH and the Regional Water Board, acting through the CDPH and the Regional Water Board, have approved an educational program that assures an equivalent degree of public notification, ...”</p>	X	<p>Regional Board staff agree. The additional educational program is based on Title 22 Code of Regulations, Chapter 3 Water Recycling Criteria, Article 4 Use Area Requirements, Section 60310(g), stating: “The Department (CDPH) may accept alternative signage and wording, or an educational program, provided the applicant demonstrates to the Department that the alternative approach will assure an equivalent degree of public notification.” Therefore, Section IV.1 has been revised as follows:</p> <p><u>“The City has the option of a public educational program¹ or signage. Each sign shall display an international symbol similar to that shown in Figure 8 to alert people who do not read English.</p>
