**TENTATIVE ORDER - TERMINATION OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR
FORMER 76 STATION NO. 6923 AT 2383 SYCAMORE DRIVE, SIMI VALLEY, CALIFORNIA
(ORDER NO. R4-2004-0180, CI-8842)**

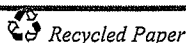
On December 13, 2004, the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) adopted Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR), Order No. R4-2004-0180 for discharge to remediate contaminated groundwater at the Former 76 Station No. 6923 located at 2383 Sycamore Drive, Simi Valley, California.

On November 10, 2009, you notified this Regional Board that the groundwater treatment technology, at the approval of Ventura County Environmental Health Division, has changed from the O₃ injection system to O₂ injection system at the site, and requested termination of WDR. Regional Board staff verified this, by reviewing the file and confirming with Ventura County Environmental Health Division, and determined that a WDR is no longer needed.

In accordance with administrative procedures, this Regional Board, at a public hearing, will consider the enclosed tentative Order, which, in part, will terminate WDR Order No. R4-2004-0180. The hearing will be held at 9:00 a.m. on July 8, 2010 at Ventura County Government Center, Board Room, located at 800 South Victoria Avenue, Ventura, California.

In order to be fully evaluated by Regional Board staff and included in the Board's agenda packet, written comments must be received at the Regional Board office by 10:00 a.m. on June 25, 2010. Failure to comply with these requirements is grounds for the Board to refuse to admit the proposed written comment or exhibit into evidence. Timely submittal of written comments is encouraged to ensure that all comments are accurately and fully included in the administrative record, that Board staff is able to provide a timely review, and that Regional Board Members have sufficient time to give full consideration to the comments and issues raised.
