**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
Public Notice No. 26-003**

**PROPOSED ISSUANCE OF
WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS AND
NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT**

The City of Thousand Oaks (hereinafter the City or the Discharger) owns and operates the Hill Canyon Treatment Plant (Hill Canyon TP), including its associated wastewater collection system and outfalls, is a publicly-owned treatment works (POTW) located at 9600 Santa Rosa Road, Camarillo, California. The Hill Canyon TP is a tertiary wastewater treatment plant with a design capacity of 14 million gallons per day (MGD) and discharges an average monthly flow of 8.8 MGD from Discharge Pont 005 (Latitude 34.213201°, Longitude -118.9211516°) to North Fork Arroyo Conejo. The Hill Canyon TP serves an estimated population of 130,000 people in the City of Thousand Oaks. The discharge is regulated under waste discharge requirements contained in Order No. R4-2019-0137, adopted by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Los Angeles Water Board) on November 14, 2019. Order No, R4- 2019-0137 serves as a permit under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES No. CA0056294). The Discharger filed a Report of Waste Discharge (ROWD) and applied for reissuance of Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) and NPDES permit on June 20, 2024. The application was deemed complete on August 30, 2024. Although the Order expired on December 31, 2024, the terms and conditions of the current Order have been administratively continued and remain in effect until new Waste Discharge Requirements and NPDES permit are adopted pursuant to this Order.

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Los Angeles Water Board tentatively proposes to issue WDRs and the NPDES permit under Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations (40 CFR) § 124.4(c)(2).

The Los Angeles Water Board will hold a public hearing on the Tentative WDRs and NPDES permit during the regular Los Angeles Water Board meeting (Board meeting) on the following date and time and at the following location:

Interested persons are invited to attend. At the public hearing, the Los Angeles Water Board will hear any testimony pertinent to the discharge, tentative WDRs, and NPDES permit. Oral testimony will be heard; however, for accuracy of the record, important testimony should be in writing.

The entire file (ROWD, other documents relied upon to develop tentative effluent limitations and special provisions, comments received, and other information) will become a part of the administrative record of this proceeding, irrespective of whether individual documents are specifically referenced during the hearing. The entire file will not be present in the hearing room. Should any interested persons desire staff to bring to the hearing any documents that are not included in the agenda packet, they must submit a written or electronic request to staff during business hours no later than five business days before the hearing. The request must identify the documents with enough specificity for staff to locate them.

NATURE OF HEARING

This will be a formal adjudicative hearing pursuant to section 648 et seq. of title 23 of the California Code of Regulations. Chapter 5 of the California Administrative Procedure Act (commencing with section 11500 of the Government Code) will not apply to this proceeding.

Ex Parte Communications Prohibited: As a quasi-adjudicative proceeding, no board member may discuss the subject of this hearing with any person, except during the public hearing itself. Any communications to the Los Angeles Water Board must be directed to staff.

PUBLIC COMMENTS AND SUBMITTAL OF EVIDENCE

Persons wishing to comment on, or object to, the tentative waste discharge requirements and NPDES permit, or submit evidence for the Board to consider, are invited to submit them in writing to [Veronica Cuevas](mailto:Veronica.Cuevas@waterboards.ca.gov) at Veronica.Cuevas@waterboards.ca.gov. To be evaluated and responded to by the Los Angeles Water Board staff, included in the Los Angeles Water Board's agenda folder, and fully considered by the Los Angeles Water Board, written comments or testimony regarding the tentative documents must be received no later than **5:00 p.m. on April 8, 2026**. Pursuant to section 648.4, title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, written comments or evidence submitted after the comment deadline will not be allowed or accepted into the Administrative Record without a showing of good cause for the delay, and in no event if any party or the Board would be unduly prejudiced by the late submittal including if staff or the Board would not have an adequate opportunity to review, consider, and respond to the comments or evidence. Additionally, if the Board receives only supportive comments, the permit may be placed on the Board's consent calendar and approved without oral testimony.

HEARING PROCEDURE

The Board meeting, of which this hearing is a part, will start at 9:00 a.m. Interested persons are invited to attend. When the agenda item is called, staff will present the matter under consideration, after which oral statements from parties or interested persons will be heard. For accuracy of the record, all important testimony should be in writing. The Los Angeles Water Board will include in the administrative record written transcriptions of oral testimony that is actually presented at the hearing. Oral testimony may be limited to

three minutes or less for each interested person, depending on the number of interested persons wishing to be heard, unless directed otherwise by the Board Chair or previously approved by the Executive Officer in writing.

Parties or interested persons with similar concerns or opinions are encouraged to choose one representative to speak and are encouraged to coordinate their presentations with each other. Parties will be advised after the receipt of public comments, but prior to the date of the hearing, of the amount of time each is allocated for presentations. That decision will be based upon the complexity and number of issues under consideration, the extent to which the parties have coordinated, the number of parties and interested persons anticipated, and the time available for the hearing. The parties are invited to contact staff not later than **May 14, 2026**, (two weeks prior to the hearing) to discuss how much time they believe is necessary for their presentations, and staff will endeavor to accommodate reasonable requests. At the conclusion of testimony, the Board will deliberate in open or closed session, and render a decision.

The Board meeting does not generally require the prior identification of witnesses, the cross examination of witnesses, or other procedures not specified in this notice. Parties or persons with special procedural requests or requests for alternative hearing procedures should contact staff, who will endeavor to accommodate reasonable requests. Objections to any procedure to be used during this hearing must be submitted in writing no later than close of business 15 business days prior to the date of the hearing. (Any objections related to the amount of time allocated for parties' presentations must be submitted within two business days of notice thereof, if that date is less than 15 business days before the hearing.) Absent such objections, any procedure not specified in this hearing notice will be waived pursuant to section 648(d) of title 23 of the California Code of Regulations. Procedural objections will not be entertained at the hearing.

If there should not be a quorum on the scheduled date of this meeting, all cases will be automatically continued to the next scheduled meeting on **June 25, 2026**. A continuance will not extend any time set forth herein.
