REVISED TENTATIVE WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS (WDRs) AND NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMITS – CITY OF LOS ANGELES, LOS ANGELES-GLENDALE WATER RECLAMATION PLANT (NPDES NO. CA0053953, CI NO. 5675)

We have revised the tentative NPDES permit dated January 28, 2010, based on written comments received by the March 1, 2010, 12:00 p.m. (noon) deadline. Written responses to those comments are enclosed. Changes in the revised tentative NPDES Order appear highlighted in the double strikeout and underline format. Comments on the revised tentative NPDES Order are not being solicited.
