Remediation Sections I and II

Update on the Former Kast Property Tank Farm, Carousel Tract Residential Neighborhood, Carson

Activities related to site investigation and cleanup work performed in May 2025 include the following:

1. On May 1, 2025, the Los Angeles Water Board reviewed the document titled *Remedial Design and Implementation Plan (RDIP) Addendum No. 6* for the former Kast Property Tank Farm. The RDIP Addendum No. 6 recommends modification of the groundwater monitoring program. The Los Angeles Water Board sent a correspondence, *Review of Remedial Design and Implementation Plan Addendum No. 6*, to Shell providing comments and requirements.
2. On May 1, 2025, the Los Angeles Water Board received documents titled *Sub-Slab Soil Vapor Monitoring Reports* for two properties located within the former Kast Property: 353 E. 249th Street and 24723 Panama Avenue. The reports summarize sub-slab soil vapor monitoring of volatile organic compounds and fixed gases at the two properties in accordance with the 2014 Revised Remedial Action Plan.
3. On May 15, 2025, the Los Angeles Water Board received a document titled *First Quarter 2025 Remediation Progress Report* for the former Kast Property Tank Farm. The report summarizes the activities related to the remediation conducted from January to March 2025, such as monitoring of groundwater, light non-aqueous phase liquid (LNAPL) recovery and sub-slab soil vapor probe sampling; the outreach conducted with residents; and the operation and maintenance of the soil vapor extraction (SVE) system.
4. On May 20, 2025, monthly LNAPL removal was conducted by Shell from monitoring wells MW-03, MW-12, and MW-18 at the Carousel Tract.
5. On May 22, 2025, the Los Angeles Water Board reviewed the documents titled *Sub-Slab Soil Vapor Monitoring Reports* for two properties located within the former Kast Property: 353 E. 249th Street and 24723 Panama Avenue. The *Sub-Slab Soil Vapor Monitoring Reports* summarizes sub-slab soil vapor monitoring of volatile organic compounds and fixed gases at the specified properties in accordance with the 2014 Revised Remedial Action Plan. The Los Angeles Water Board sent a concurrence email to Shell regarding the findings within the reports.
6. To date the cleanup of 285 (100 %) properties/homes have been completed and the SVE system is fully operational.

Former Athens Tank Farm / Ujima Village Apartments and Ervin Magic Johnson Regional Park (EMJRP), Los Angeles

Activities related to the environmental site investigation of the Former Athens Tank Farm conducted in May 2025 are summarized below:

1. Recent and ongoing activities for the former Athens Tank Farm site are as follows:

Phase III Remediation Systems:

- a. Groundwater monitoring wells ATF-10A (shallow) and ATF-10B (deep) continued to be inaccessible during May 2025 due to the placement of fencing by the Ujima Housing Corporation (UHC). Access to these monitoring wells continues to be in negotiation with the UHC. These wells will be monitored and sampled during the next monitoring event following an access agreement. Kleinfelder will continue to reach out to UHC staff to resolve this matter and may request assistance from Los Angeles Water Board staff to facilitate access.
- b. Weekly Phase III remediation systems O&M activities are ongoing.

NAPL Recovery Trailer

- i. The NAPL Recovery Trailer was fully operational throughout May 2025.
- ii. The NAPL Recovery Trailer has been and continues to operate primarily on wells ATF-19B and ATF-21B; and
- iii. Attempted NAPL pneumatic recovery in well ATF-13B using low-flow rate
 - Results showed NAPL recovery like that of manual bailing due to slow recharge of NAPL into well ATF-13B (see Tier II info below)
- iv. The NAPL Trailer was positioned over the well ATF-21B in May 2025.
 - NAPL Tier I cumulative recovery as of February 28, 2025, using NAPL Recovery Trailer was 6,780 gallons (624 gallons in 1st Qtr. 2025)
- v. NAPL Tier II manual bailing in May 2025 was conducted primarily on groundwater monitoring wells ATF-13B and ATF-19B; and
 - NAPL Tier II cumulative recovery as of February 28, 2025, with manual bailing methods was 649.5 gallons (69.5 gallons in 1st Qtr. 2025);
- vi. NAPL Tier III recovery (oleophilic absorbent socks) is currently deployed in 11 wells: ATF-5B, ATF-10A, ATF-22B, ATF-26B, ATF-28B, ATF-29B; KLFOB-01, KLFOB-02; KLFSVE-01, KLFSVE-02 and KLFSVE-03.
 - A total of 4 absorbent socks were replaced in the first quarter of 2025. The socks were replaced in ATF-28B and ATF-29B.
 - A cumulative total of 166 absorbent socks have been replaced as of February 28, 2025 (4 socks replaced during the 1st Quarter 2025).
- vii. Cumulative NAPL (Tier I and II) through February 28, 2025, was 7,429

gallons.

Air/Bio-Sparge System

- i. The Los Angeles Water Board approved the Phase III Air Sparge System Shutdown Request on January 12, 2024. Therefore, the air sparge/bio-sparge system was non-operational during May 2025. All Phase III Air Sparge System equipment, piping and wells will remain onsite for future use if necessary pursuant to the Los Angeles Water Board's letter.
- ii. As of February 28, 2025, the cumulative estimated mass of VOCs removed using the Phase III air sparge/bio-sparge system was 250,842 pounds.

Commercial, Industrial, and Institutional (CII) Stormwater Program Update

On November 2, 2023, staff of the CII Unit finalized and released the Los Angeles Water Board's responses to 33 written public comments received on the tentative CII Permit. These responses led to revisions of the CII Permit for certain CII Facilities within the Dominguez Channel/Inner and Outer Los Angeles and Long Beach Harbor Watershed and the Los Cerritos Channel/Alamitos Bay Watershed.

Subsequently, on November 20, 2024, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) released its final designation memorandum. In response, the Los Angeles Water Board will release a revised version of the tentative CII Permit that aligns with

USEPA's designation. The revised will be presented for consideration and potential adoption at an upcoming Board meeting.

Concurrently, staff continued development of the Stormwater Multiple Application and Report Tracking System (SMARTS) online database for the CII Permit. The SMARTS workgroup, which includes staff from the CII Unit, the State Water Board's Department of Water Quality and Division of Information Technology (DIT), and DIT's contractors, meets on a bi-weekly basis to refine database enhancement and ensure system readiness upon the adoption of the revised CII permit.

The CII Unit continued testing SMARTS on electronic Notice of Intent (eNOI) process and provided feedback to address errors and further improve the process. The CII Unit also presented analysis and design of the Notice of Termination (NOT) and Change of Information (COI) processes to DIT's contractors for SMARTS development. The analysis evaluated the applicability of existing SMARTS functionalities to the CII Program, while the design work defined the process flow, functions to be imported and/or developed, and acceptance criteria for the implementation.

SB 1215 Wastewater Consolidation (WWC) Program Update

The Senate Bill 1215 (SB 1215) Wastewater Consolidation (WWC) Program continues to advance wastewater service planning and implementation in priority disadvantaged and severely disadvantaged communities (DACs/SDACs) within Region 4. Program staff (staff) are working collaboratively with the State Water Resources Control Board's Division of Financial Assistance (DFA), local sewer service providers, and technical assistance (TA) partners, including the Rural Community Assistance Corporation and Moonshot Missions.

April 2025 Update

Disadvantaged Community Status Evaluation

On April 22, 2025, staff applied DFA's approved methodology to evaluate 2023 Median Household Income (MHI) data and determine DAC status for Census Tracts within Region 4. This analysis supports project eligibility determinations and prioritization of funding resources.

City of El Monte Project

- On April 7, 2025, staff projected the availability of additional grant funding to support septic-to-sewer conversions, demonstrating alignment with the City's infrastructure improvement and public health goals. Staff also finalized an ArcGIS-based mapping layout identifying parcels currently served by onsite septic systems to support feasibility assessments and planning.
- On April 17, 2025, staff conducted an initial meeting with City of El Monte representatives to introduce the SB 1215 WWC Program. Staff presented

available grant opportunities and provided key reference materials, including the Planning and Design (P&D) Funding Application, TA Request Form, and a program overview presentation.

Ojai Valley Projects (Trusty Lane, North Rice Road, West of North Ventura Ave, and East Casitas Springs)

- On April 25, 2025, staff provided DFA's recommendations to the Ojai Valley Sanitary District (OVSD), advising the inclusion of a Project Engineering Report and Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Construction Application in the grant Scope of Work. This recommendation is intended to strengthen the technical and financial readiness of OVSD's current and future submissions.

May 2025 Update

Statewide Coordination

On May 22, 2025, staff participated in a statewide Wastewater Consolidation Coordination Meeting. The discussion focused on the FY 2025–26 Draft CWSRF Intended Use Plan (IUP), with an emphasis on funding priorities such as septic-to-sewer conversions, regionalization, and resolution of violations of Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) and NPDES permits.

City of El Monte Project

- On May 20, 2025, staff engaged in follow-up coordination with the City to review technical and financial components of the P&D funding application and provided detailed guidance for a complete and timely submittal. Supporting documentation, including required forms and a project-specific checklist, was shared in advance.
- On May 27, 2025, the City expressed strong interest in submitting a funding application and requested a follow-up coordination meeting. Staff provided a parcel-level analysis identifying up to 32 eligible residential properties and a preliminary grant estimate of approximately \$4 million.
- On May 30, 2025, staff conducted additional outreach to reinforce the steps needed for a complete P&D application submittal and again provided all necessary documentation and guidance materials.

Ojai Valley Projects (Trusty Lane, North Rice Road, West of North Ventura Ave, and East Casitas Springs)

- On May 13, 2025, staff met with OVSD to discuss technical and financial planning requirements. OVSD was advised to upload three years of audited financial statements and a five-year budget (FY 2025–2030) to meet funding application requirements.

- On May 28, 2025, staff informed OVSD that the draft Plan of Study for the North Rice Road project was ready for review. Comments were provided specifically on the Scope of Work, Cost Estimate, and Deliverable Schedule.
- On May 30, 2025, staff notified OVSD that the draft Plans of Study for the East Casitas Springs and West of North Ventura Avenue projects were also ready for review. Key sections requiring OVSD input, including Scope of Work, Cost Estimate, and Deliverable Schedule, were highlighted.

Section 401 Water Quality Certification Program

Ballona Wetlands Restoration

The Ballona Wetlands TMDL was established by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) on March 26, 2012, to address habitat alteration, reduced tidal flushing, hydromodification and exotic vegetation impairment resulting from the historical placement of fill on the wetlands, the channelization of Ballona Creek, and other anthropogenic activities. The TMDL established load allocations for sediment and invasive exotic vegetation removal across the site. In addition, since the attainment of the beneficial uses for the wetlands require not just the removal of legacy sediment, but the restoration of adequate wetland conditions, the TMDL also established load allocations based on the restoration of historical marsh habitats as an alternative to the sediment allocations. The TMDL supported all restoration efforts and planning that would achieve the numeric targets and allocations established in the TMDL.

Since the establishment of the TMDL, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) developed a plan to restore native coastal wetlands and upland habitats in order to return the

degraded Ballona wetlands to a system with large contiguous areas of diverse intertidal wetland habitats, with wide transition and buffer areas that sustain high levels of biodiversity. This plan, called the Ballona Wetlands Restoration Project, will address the impairments for which the Ballona Wetlands TMDL was written by achieving extensive load reductions in both sediment and exotic vegetation and effectively restoring marsh habitat.

Progress in the implementation of the Ballona Wetlands Restoration Project and the Ballona Wetlands TMDL has been delayed as a result of litigation brought under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). In May 2023, a Los Angeles County Superior Court judge issued a ruling that certain aspects of the flood control analysis in the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) must be updated. In all other respects of the litigation, CDFW prevailed.

Since March 2025, staff have been working with CDFW on a contract using the Board's TMDL and Basin Planning contract funding to complete the required EIR revisions. However, in June 2025, staff learned that the funding was cut. Staff are pursuing other sources of funding to assist CDFW with completing the required EIR revisions. In addition, staff are ready to work closely with CDFW and stakeholders to process permits or other requirements necessary to help move the project forward as quickly as possible. Basin Plan, TMDL, and Nonpoint Source Programs

Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program

Staff continue monthly calls with the Ventura County Agriculture Irrigated Lands Group (VCAILG) and the Los Angeles Irrigated Lands Group (LAILG) to implement the General Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges from Irrigated Lands (Order No. R4-2023-0353) (2023 Ag Order). In preparation for individual grower deliverables required to comply with the 2023 Ag Order, staff held office hours on April 15, 2025 at the Ventura County Farm Bureau office to answer farm-specific questions.

Surface Water Ambient Monitoring Program (SWAMP)

Los Angeles Water Board staff in the SWAMP program have been actively involved in post-fire recovery. In April and May 2025, this included:

- Continuing oversight of the contract with Southern California Coastal Water Research Project (SCCWRP), funded by the Ocean Protection Council, to coordinate regional post-fire monitoring efforts. SCCWRP hosted the second formal meeting of the "Post-fire Monitoring Workgroup for Aquatic Habitats" on April 2, 2025. SCCWRP posted its interactive map of monitoring sites in the Eaton and Palisades fire areas to the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health's [Water Monitoring](#) dashboard webpage. Staff participated in the Post-fire Water Quality-Data Interpretation and Post-fire Water Quality-Method Comparison and Reporting meetings on May 28 and 29, 2005, respectively.
- Conducting water quality analysis on ocean water samples. In addition to samples collected by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health in January and February 2025, the Los Angeles Water Board staff collected ocean water samples on March 13 and May 1, 2025.

Samples were analyzed by the Board's laboratory for general chemistry, total and dissolved metals, PAHs, VOCs, PFAS, and asbestos. The analysis costs were covered by the Board's funds in our statewide analytical contract. Staff posted its analysis of the ocean sampling results to the [LARWQCB 2025 Post-Fire Water Quality Monitoring webpage](#). Staff compared ocean water quality results with [U.S. EPA risk-based screening levels for recreation in water](#) and [Ocean Plan objectives for consumption of fish](#). All results were below these values or within [background concentrations](#).

- Collecting beach sediment and sand samples and analyzing results. The Board contracted with Moss Landing Marine Labs to collect samples from 11 beaches and four storm drains/creek outfalls from Zuma beach to RAT beach. The sampling was conducted in February and April 2025. Funding for this effort was obtained through emergency response funds. The Board had the results analyzed for total metals, PAHs, and PCBs. Staff posted the results of the February 2025 analysis to the [LARWQCB 2025 Post-Fire Water Quality Monitoring webpage](#) on April 8, 2025, and updated the webpage with the results from the April 2025 analysis on June 6, 2025. The board compared sediment/beach sand results with [U.S. EPA risk screening levels for residential soil](#) and [California-specific risk screening levels for residential soil](#) in the Los Angeles region. All results were below these values or within [background concentrations](#).

Watershed Regulatory Section

On April 8, 2025, Watershed Regulatory Section staff attended the Annual Regulators Meeting, hosted by the West Basin Municipal Water District (District) at Donald L. Dear Building, in the City of Carson, California. The annual meeting was held to provide key updates on the progress of the District's recycled water projects, including current challenges, upcoming milestones, and overall project schedule. The meeting also served as a platform to identify opportunities for improvement in agency coordination, document reviews, as well as to encourage collaboration among stakeholders. Representatives from the State Water Resources Control Board Division of Drinking Water and Los Angeles County Public Health Cross-Connection Control Program were also in attendance.

On May 13, 2025, Staff attended a site tour at the Boeing Santa Susana Field Laboratory (SSFL) to provide an overview of the facility and introduction of the new SSFL Surface Water Expert Panel (SWEP) member, Dr. Gregory Pasternack. Dr. Pasternack is a professor in Land, Air, and Water Resources at the University of California, Davis. Dr. Pasternack replaces Dr. Mike Josselyn, who retired and vacated his position on the SWEP in 2023. The focus of Dr. Pasternack's applied research is on physical and ecological science to understand how the naturally complex landscape works and the development of methods and software for designing more natural, functional environments. The tour focused on the historical nature of the facility, the status of remediation, and the work of the SWEP work to date. Stops were made at the bioswales, the shooting range, culvert modifications along the northern drainage, outfall locations, stormwater treatment systems, and the Area I Burn Pit, where remediation activities were being conducted.

On May 28, 2025, staff attended a community meeting for Pure Water Los Angeles, hosted by the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) and Los Angeles Sanitation and Environment (LASAN). The purpose of the meeting was to receive feedback from the community on the development of an advanced water treatment facility at Hyperion WRP that will produce up to 230 million gallons per day of recycled water, the different pipe alignments being considered for conveying the recycled water to other parts of the city, and using the water for indirect and direct potable reuse. Some of the concerns from the community included the amount of power that will be required to treat and convey the recycled water and the quality of the water. LADWP and LASAN plan to coordinate additional community meetings in the future to continue receiving community feedback as Pure Water Los Angeles is developed.
