

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board

April 1-2, 2025

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Butcher Slough Cleanup and Restoration *Heidi Bauer*

Butcher Slough, a remarkable and ecologically rich area nestled within Arcata and the Humboldt Bay watershed, is set to undergo a major environmental transformation. Located just south of Arcata, the 27-acre slough has a storied history and plays a vital role in the regional ecosystem, offering a unique blend of freshwater and tidal influences that foster a rich habitat for diverse wildlife.

Originally home to the Wiyot people, who have inhabited the Humboldt Bay area since time immemorial, Butcher Slough later became the site of a lumber and plywood mill, operating from the 1940s to the 1970s. This industrial activity left behind contaminants including polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), dioxins, heavy metals, and hydrocarbons, which eventually led to regulatory oversight of the investigation and cleanup by the Regional Water Board's Site Cleanups Unit.

Efforts to restore Butcher Slough began as early as 1984, and the area has since

transformed into a refuge for birds, fish, and other wildlife, including endangered coho salmon. Its unique tidal habitat serves as a vital stopover for migratory birds, contributing to the Humboldt Bay Complex's biodiversity. The area is also ecologically important with an array of brackish plant life that helps maintain the overall health of the bay.

As part of their ongoing commitment to restoration, the City of Arcata and local environmental leaders, including Humboldt Waterkeeper, recently secured a California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) Equitable Community Revitalization Grant (ECRG). Awarded in 2024, the grant will support comprehensive environmental assessments, targeted sampling, and the development of a tailored cleanup plan. The project also includes two community workshops aimed at informing and engaging residents in the restoration process, allowing the community to play a role in shaping Butcher Slough's future.

The grant marks an exciting new phase in the slough's restoration. Once the project is complete, Butcher Slough will offer enhanced habitats for wildlife and safe, accessible trails for the public. Community leaders see this as a significant step toward healing a oncecontaminated site and preserving a cherished natural resource.

Butcher Slough today boasts an Interpretive Center, remnants of the lumber mill's log pond, and serene trails along Jolly Giant Creek, attracting visitors interested in history, ecology, and the beauty of the Humboldt Bay area. When restoration is complete, residents and tourists alike can enjoy a cleaner, healthier environment where wildlife and nature can thrive.

As restoration efforts progress, the community can look forward to a revitalized Butcher Slough—a testament to the Regional Water Board's commitment to preserving the area's natural heritage and promoting environmental restoration and resilience.

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Enforcement Report for December 2024 Executive Officer's Report Jeremiah Puget

Summary of Enforcement Actions issued between November 5, 2024 – March 5, 2025

Throughout the year, with support from the State Water Board's Office of Enforcement (OE), Regional Water Board staff (Staff) develop and manage enforcement cases starting informally through direct correspondence including issuing Notices of Violations (NOVs) and pursuing a progressive enforcement approach that results in formal enforcement actions such as Cleanup and Abatement Orders (CAOs), Cease and Desist Orders (CDOs), and Administrative Civil Liability (ACL) Complaints. Once Staff determine that an enforcement action will result in the issuance of an ACL Complaint, the Enforcement Team prepares supporting evidence and provides the discharger(s) an opportunity to discuss the facts relating to the violations, including the option of settlement.

Table 1 summarizes NOVs and Staff Enforcement Letters. Table 2 summarizes CAOs, Investigative Orders (13267/13383 Orders), Notices of Non-Compliance (NNCs), regulatory directives, and No Further Action Letters (NFAs). Table 3 summarizes proposed and adopted CDOs and Time Schedule Orders (TSOs) as well as ACL Complaints, ACL Orders, settlement negotiations pending the adoption of a final Stipulated ACL Order, and the status of Compliance Projects (CPs) and Supplemental Environmental Projects (SEPs). During this reporting period, Staff issued 35 NOVs, three enrollment directives, two NFAs, one Draft TSO, one Draft CAO, one ACL Order, one ACL Complaint, one Draft TSO, and continued settlement negotiations with dischargers on four cases.




