Response to Written Public Comments

2025 Basin Plan Remediation

June 13, 2025

Introduction

The *Water Quality Control Plan for the North Coast Region* (Basin Plan) forms the basis for regulatory actions taken by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region (North Coast Water Board) to protect waters of the state and to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws, including the California Water Code and the federal Clean Water Act. A change to the Basin Plan requires a Basin Plan amendment.

The 2025 Basin Plan Remediation includes proposed non-regulatory amendments to the Basin Plan to incorporate applicable provisions of statewide plans and policies, keep pace with changes in regulations, more accurately describe the physical and social characteristics within the region, improve the overall clarity of the Basin Plan, and comply with accessibility requirements. This Basin Plan Remediation Project was described in the 2023 Triennial Review Staff Report and included in the Planning Program Workplan for Fiscal Years 2024-2027.

North Coast Water Board staff (Staff) prepared a project staff report, track changes draft of the Basin Plan amendment, clean draft of the proposed 2025 Basin Plan, and new Appendix 2 Basin Plan Crosswalk for public review. A public notice announcing the public comment period and public hearing date was sent to the basin planning email subscription list and posted on the Basin Plan webpage with the project documents for a 45-day public review and comment period from March 13 - April 28, 2025.

Staff received one email from Friends of the Shasta River within the comment period, containing multiple comments. Staff appreciate the comments submitted and present them to the North Coast Water Board in this document. Staff reviewed and considered all comments received, and what follows are Staff's responses to the public comments.

6.3.8.1	"The Shasta River is now being used as a drinking water source for the city of Montague. I do not know if that is now included in its beneficial uses, but should be."	The Shasta River and its tributaries have MUN designated an existing beneficial use in Table 2-1 of the Basin Plan.
6.3.8	Table numbering suggestions.	The tables are numbered consecutively throughout chapter 6, the numbering does not restart in each action plan.
6.3.8.8	Reassessment is likely to occur every three years during the Basin Planning Triennial Review process. "Is this every six years now?"	Thank you for the clarifying question. Section 13240 of the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act requires water quality control plans to be periodically reviewed, and Section 303(c)(1) of the federal Clean Water Act requires a review of water quality control plans every three years to keep pace with changes in regulation, new technologies, and physical changes within the region. The next Triennial Review of the North Coast Water Board's Basin Plan will begin in 2026. The 305(b)/303(d) Integrated Report is a comprehensive review of readily available surface water quality data. The Integrated Report process is administered by the State Water Resources Control Board and the North Coast Water Board conducts data review and assessment when our region is "on cycle," which occurs every six years.
