Humboldt County

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) proposes to adopt National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. R1-2026-0019 for the DG Fairhaven Power Facility (Facility) which will replace Order No. R1-2018-0013.

This item will be open for public comment between **March 16, 2026, and April 17, 2026**. Comments and questions regarding the draft Order should be submitted to the Regional Water Board email at NorthCoast@waterboards.ca.gov, Attention: Sabrina Cegielski. A public hearing concerning the tentative Order will be held during the Regional Water Board meeting scheduled for **June 16-17, 2026**. Further information regarding comment procedures and the public hearing is below.

Permittee and Facility Information

DG Fairhaven, LLC (Permittee) is the owner and operator of the Facility. The Facility is an electrical power generating facility located at 97 Bay Street, Samoa, CA 95564 on the Samoa Peninsula of Humboldt Bay. The Facility combusts wood waste to produce electricity using a steam-turbine power generation process. The Facility discharges approximately 0.130 million gallons per day of process water to the Pacific Ocean through Humboldt Bay Harbor, Recreation & Conservation District's outfall, located at the former Samoa Pulp Mill to the north of the Facility. Process waters discharged include cooling tower blowdown, low volume wastes (including: boiler water blowdown, reverse osmosis concentrate, and demineralizer back-wash), and intermittent wastes (including: cooling tower cleaning wastes). The process water is discharged to internal outfalls from boiler blowdown, demineralizer back flush, and reverse osmosis concentrate and cooling tower blowdown that combine to discharge at 40° 49' 10" N

latitude and 124° 13' 32" W longitude to the Pacific Ocean. The Harbor District outfall is a 48-inch diameter line that terminates approximately 1.5 miles off-shore.

Public Hearing Procedures

A public hearing to consider comments and objections to the proposed order is scheduled for the Regional Water Board's **June 16-17, 2026** Board Meeting, or as announced in the Regional Water Board's agenda. This public meeting is currently scheduled to take place in-person and via video and teleconference at 5550 Skylane Blvd. Suite A, Santa Rosa, CA 95403, but the format may be changed in the future. Please follow the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board website for information on how to participate in the meeting and any updates regarding this agenda item.

Live video and audio broadcasts of the public hearing will be available via the internet and can be accessed at the [CalEPA Public Meeting Live Webcasts website](https://video.calepa.ca.gov/) (<https://video.calepa.ca.gov/>). The public hearing will be recorded.

Please be aware that dates and venues may change. You can access the current agenda for changes in dates and locations at [North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board Meetings](https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/northcoast/board_info/board_meetings/), (https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/northcoast/board_info/board_meetings/). At the public hearing, the Regional Water Board will consider whether to affirm, reject, or modify the proposed order.

In order for the Regional Water Board to consider any written evidentiary material concerning this hearing, any documents, including comments, written technical reports and other evidentiary material, must be submitted to the Regional Water Board email at NorthCoast@waterboards.ca.gov, Attention: Sabrina Cegielski **no later than 5:00 pm, on April 17, 2026**. All documents that are received timely will be distributed to the Regional Water Board members and interested persons. These records will also become a permanent part of the administrative record for this public hearing.

Except at the discretion of the Regional Water Board Chair, written material received after the above date will not be accepted. If the Chair chooses to accept late written material, that material will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party or the Board. The Chair may choose to modify this rule upon a showing of severe hardship (California Code of Regulations, Title 23, sections 648.1 and 648.4).

Written comments and evidence must be submitted to the Regional Water Board **no later than 5:00pm on April 17, 2026**. Oral comments or testimony at the hearing may summarize or explain timely submitted, or late-accepted written evidence but shall not introduce new evidence.

The time limit for oral testimony or comments will be set by the Regional Water Board Chair and are subject to change. These time limits normally allow no more than 20 minutes each for Regional Water Board staff and Dischargers. Other interested persons may also provide testimony at this public hearing. However, any testimony given by someone other than staff or the Discharger is typically limited to 5 minutes. A timer may be used, and speakers are expected to honor time limits. Where speakers can be grouped by affiliation or interest, such groups will be expected to select a spokesperson to avoid unnecessary or repetitive testimony.
