## **Errata Sheet**

Order No. R1-2024-0056 General Waste Discharge Requirements for Commercial Vineyards in the North Coast Region

June 12, 2025

North Coast Water Quality Control Board staff identified late revisions to the Proposed Vineyard Order that are not currently reflected in the document released to the public on May 23, 2025. These revisions are staff-initiated, non-substantive, and meant to clarify certain elements of the Order in response to ex parte communication following document release on May 23, 2025.

Staff recommend that the following changes be made to Order No. R1-2024-0056 concurrent with its adoption:

- 1. Add the following language (underlined) to Provision 7 on p. 48 of the Order:
  - 7) To comply with Sediment and Erosion Control requirements of this Order, Enrollees shall implement one of four Compliance Options as summarized in Table 5 and described below in this section. <u>For vineyards with</u> <u>Agricultural Drainage Structures</u>, Enrollees shall conduct the required Management Practice Effectiveness Monitoring for their Compliance Option as described in Section III of Attachment A: MRP for Individual Enrollees and Section II of Attachment B: MRP for Enrollees in a Coalition.
- 2. Replace the definition of Ground Disturbing Management Practices as featured in Appendix I: Acronyms, Definitions, and Endnotes (p.79 of the Order) to the following:

**Ground Disturbing Management Practices**. New or replacement Management Practices that, when constructed, disrupt, compact, or expose the soil surface. The construction of these practices includes, but is not limited to: digging, trenching, clearing, grading, excavating, and stockpiling. Ground Disturbing Management Practices do not include routine farming practices (e.g., cultivating or tilling).

- 3. Revise Provision 7(b) on p. 22 of Attachment B: Monitoring and Reporting Program for Enrollees in a Coalition to read:
  - b) Township and Range
