The California Council for Environmental and Economic Balance (CCEEB) is a non-partisan, non-profit coalition of business, labor, and public leaders that advances strategies for a strong economy and a healthy environment. CCEEB has reviewed your proposal to amend Sections 2050, 2050.5 and 2051 of Title 23 relating to Petitions regarding Regional Boards' actions.

CCEEB believes strongly that a petitioner's due process rights are denied when the State Board is unable to act on petitions in a timely manner. We also agree with other commenters that Section 2053 pertaining to stays also be addressed within the scope of the proposed changes. Without such a change, the problem of State Board action would likely persist for stay requests even if it is remedied for petitions.
