The Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Los Angeles Water Board) transmitted a letter including the revised tentative Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) and Water Reclamation Requirements (WRRs) permit for the city of Santa Monica's Sustainable Water Infrastructure Project on January 28, 2021.

In accordance with administrative procedures, the Los Angeles Water Board at a public hearing held on February 11, 2021, reviewed the revised tentative requirements, and considered all the factors in the case, and adopted WDRs and WRRs permit Order No. R4-2021-0044.
