WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS - 1801 AVENUE OF THE STARS, L.P., WESTFIELD BUILDING, LOS ANGELES, CA. (NPDES NO. CA0053287, CI NO. 5854)

Our letter dated September 9, 2010, transmitted revised tentative Waste Discharge Requirements for your discharge of groundwater seepage and storm water runoff from 1801 Avenue of the Stars, L.P., into a storm drain, tributary to Ballona Creek.

Pursuant to Division 7 of the California Water Code, this Regional Board at a public hearing held on October 7, 2010, reviewed the revised tentative requirements, considered all factors in the case, and adopted Order No. R4-2010-0178 (copies attached) relative to the Westfield Building's waste discharge. Order No. R4-2010-0178 serves as your NPDES permit for 1801 Avenue of the Stars, L.P.; becomes effective on November 7, 2010; and, expires on September 10, 2015. Section 13376 of the California Water Code requires that a complete application for a new permit must be filed at least 180 days before the expiration date. Your first monitoring report must be received in the Regional Board office by February 1, 2011, and will cover the November and December 2010 sampling period.

When submitting monitoring or technical reports to the Regional Board, as required by your "Monitoring and Reporting Program", please send them ATTN: Information Technology Unit and include a reference to "Compliance File No. 5854" for 1801 Avenue of the Stars, L.P..
