**WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS - VOPAK TERMINAL LOS ANGELES, INCORPORATED (MARINE TERMINAL, WILMINGTON, CA.) (NPDES NO. CA0055247, CI NO. 5985)**

Our letter dated September 17, 2007, transmitted a tentative order for renewal of your permit to discharge wastes under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES).

Pursuant to Division 7 of the California Water Code, this Regional Board at a public hearing held on November 1, 2007, reviewed the revised tentative requirements, considered all factors in the case, and adopted Order No. R4-2007-0057 (copy attached) relative to this waste discharge. Order No. R4-2007-0057 serves as your permit under the NPDES and expires on October 10, 2012. Section 13376 of the California Water Code requires that an application for a new permit must be filed at least 180 days before the expiration date.

You are required to implement the *Monitoring and Reporting Program* (MRP) on the effective date of Order No. R4-2007-0057. Your first monitoring report for the December reporting period is due by February 1, 2008. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, Attn: Information Technology Unit.

When submitting monitoring, technical reports, or any correspondence regarding the discharge under Order No. R4-2007-0057 to the Regional Board, please include a reference to *Compliance File No. CI 5985 and NPDES No. CA00055247*, which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Please do not combine your discharge monitoring reports with other reports. Please submit each type of report as a separate document.

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
