TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT – CALIFORNIA AMERICAN WATER COMPANY, ARLINGTON WELL NO. 2, 5107 ARLINGTON AVENUE, BALDWIN HILLS, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994001, CI-7441)

In our letter dated September 26, 1994, we determined that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. 97-045, *General NPDES and Waste Discharge Requirements for Groundwater Discharges from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

Your letter dated November 15, 2002, informed the Board that the pumping test on Arlington Well No. 2 has been completed. Therefore, the NPDES permit is no longer needed. On February 7, 2003, Board staff inspected the site and verified that there is no discharge of groundwater to the storm drain. Since there is no discharge, coverage under Board Order No. 97-045 for the subject site is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes.
