**TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS –
WALT DISNEY PICTURES AND TELEVISION, 500 S. BUENA VISTA STREET, BURBANK,
CA (Order No. 93-010, CI-7474, File No. 92-60(03))**


In our letter dated January 3, 1995, we informed you that the discharge of purge waters produced from an ongoing groundwater monitoring program required at your facility is regulated under Order No. 93-010, *General Waste Discharge Requirements for Specified Discharges to Groundwater in Santa Clara River and Los Angeles River Basins*.

In a letter dated June 10, 2009, you notified the Regional Board that the project was completed on July 2002 and you requested termination of your enrollment under the WDR.

Since the project has been completed and discharge of purge water is no longer occurring, enrollment under Order No. 93-010 for the facility is hereby terminated with the exception of enforcement under the terms of the permit.
