TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – LONGDEN WELL REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT, SAN MARINO, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994001, CI-7843)

In our letter dated November 7, 1997, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. 97-045, *General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Groundwater Discharges from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

On November 15, 2002, you informed Regional Board staff that the California-American Water Company has ceased discharging groundwater from the above-subject site to San Gabriel River. Therefore, you requested termination of coverage under NPDES permit number CAG994001 for the project site.

Board Staff inspected the facility on January 22, 2003, and verified that there is no discharge of wastewater from the project site. Since there is no discharge, coverage under Board Order No. 97-045 for the subject facility is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes.

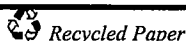
