TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT—CITY OF LOS ANGELES DEPARTMENT OF WATER AND POWER—THE STONE HOLLYWOOD TRUNKLINE UNIT 4 PROJECT, BETWEEN CRESCENT HEIGHTS DRIVE & LA BREA AVENUE, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG674001, CI-7934)


In our letter dated October 22, 2004, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2004-0109, *Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Low Treat Hydrostatic Test Water to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by the Board on July 1, 2004, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

We have received and reviewed your letter requesting termination of coverage under the General Permit. The letter indicated that you have completed the above-referenced pipeline hydrostatic project and the subject general permit is no longer needed.

On June 3, 2008, Board staff inspected the project site and verified that there is no discharge of wastewater from the site to the storm drain. Since there is no discharge from the subject site, coverage under Board Order No. R4-2004-0109, General NPDES Permit No. CAG674001, for the subject project is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes.
