COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS – PIER S, TERMINAL ISLAND, THE PORT OF LONG BEACH, LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994002, CI–8051)

We have completed our review of your request for modification of the general Waste Discharge Requirements and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit for the above-referenced facility.

Based on the information provided, we have determined that your discharge of treated groundwater from construction dewatering activity meets the conditions to be regulated under Order No. 97-043, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Treated Groundwater from Construction and Project Dewatering Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties, adopted by this Board on May 12, 1997.

You were previously covered under general NPDES Permit No. CAG994001, Order No. 97-045, *General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System and Waste Discharge Requirements for Groundwater Discharges from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties.* This general permit covered discharges of untreated groundwater. Based on the information and water quality data you have provided, your groundwater dewatering wastes at the project site will exceed the water quality criteria for petroleum fuel and volatile organic compounds. Therefore, your discharge is more appropriately covered under NPDES Permit No. CAG994002. Your coverage under NPDES Permit No. CAG994001, Order No. 97-045 will be terminated and a separate termination letter will be sent to you at a later date.

Enclosed are your Waste Discharge Requirements, which also serve as your NPDES permit, consisting of Order No. 97-043 and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. CI-8051. Prior to starting discharge, a representative sample of the effluent shall be taken and analyzed to determine compliance with the discharge limitations. The groundwater discharge flows into Long Beach Harbor; therefore, the discharge limits in Attachment A of Order No. 97-043 are not applicable to your discharge.

The Monitoring and Reporting Program requires you to implement the monitoring program on the effective date of coverage under this permit. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, <u>ATTN: Information Technology Unit.</u> When submitting monitoring or technical reports to

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the Regional Board per these requirements, please include a reference to "Compliance File No. CI-8051 and NPDES No. CAG994002", which will assure that the reports are directed to the appropriate file and staff. Also, please do not combine other reports with your monitoring reports. Submit each type of report as a separate document.

In order to avoid future annual fees, please submit written notification when the project has been completed and the permit is no longer needed.

We are sending a copy of Order No. 97-043 only to the applicant. For those on the mailing list, please refer to the Board Order sent to you previously. A copy of the Order will be furnished to anyone who requests it.
