WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS AND TIME SCHEDULE ORDER FOR PARADISE COVE MOBILE HOME PARK WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM, 28128 PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY, MALIBU, CALIFORNIA (FILE NO. 01-083, CI-8342)

Our letter of May 7, 2002, transmitted the revised tentative Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) including Monitoring and Reporting Program and an accompanying tentative Time Schedule Order (TSO), for your waste discharge at Paradise Cove Mobile Home Park.

Pursuant to Division 7 of the California Water Code, this Regional board at a public meeting held on May 23, 2002, reviewed the revised tentative WDRs and TSO, considering all factors in the case, adopted WDR Order No. R4-2002-0108 and TSO Order No. R4-2002-0109 (copies enclosed) relative to this discharge. Standard Provisions, which are a part of the WDRs, are also enclosed.

The tentative Orders for the Paradise Cove Mobile Home Park, as previously sent in the Regional Boards letter of April 22, 2002, were revised per the attached Change Sheets Nos. 1 and 2. In addition, the Board directed that the tentative WDR, MRP, and TSO include the following revisions (deletions are in strikethrough and additions are underlined):

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

Change No. 1: Item 7. c) of E. PROVISIONS on page 9 was merged with the next item, Item 8. The mistake and the correction are shown below (This typographical error may not have been on the circulated May 7, 2002 tentatives):

- 7. c) A change in any condition, or the discovery of any information, that requires either a temporary or permanent reduction or elimination of the authorized ~~The Discharger shall furnish, within a reasonable time, any information the~~ discharge.
- 8. The Discharger shall furnish, within a reasonable time, any information the Regional Board may request to determine whether cause exists for modifying, revoking and reissuing, or terminating this Order. The Discharger ...

Change No. 2: Page T-4, Item III B. had language added in Change Sheet No. 2 and the Board adopted additional language to this item to read as shown below:

- ... which is due July 15, 2002. The Executive Officer may modify the groundwater monitoring program based upon the submission of final wastewater treatment/disposal plans. Should there be any changes to the provisions of the groundwater monitoring program, public comments must be solicited.

Your first monitoring report under these Requirements is due to this Regional Board by July 15, 2002. All monitoring reports should be sent to the Regional Board, Attn: Information Technology Unit.

Please reference all monitoring reports to our Compliance File No. CI-8342. We would appreciate if you would not combine other reports, such as progress or technical reports, with your monitoring reports.
