REVISIONS TO MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM NO. CI-8479 – FORMER PNEUMO ABEX AEROSPACE FACILITY, 3155 WEST 5TH STREET, OXNARD, CALIFORNIA, (CAO NO. 95-021, SLIC NO. 253A, SITE ID. NO. 2043000)

Dear Mr. Larson:

Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) staff have reviewed the January 7, 2003 letter from Environmental Forensic Investigations, Inc., requesting revisions to Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) No. CI-8479, under General Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) Order No. R4-2002-0030. This WDR/MRP applies to a proposed pilot study using the injection of hydrogen releasing compound into the soil and aquifer to treat an area containing elevated concentrations of volatile organic compounds. The modifications: 1) reduce the points of injection from nine to one; 2) reduce the monitoring locations from 19 to nine; 3) reduce monitoring events from 13 to 11 for the first year of operation; and reducing the analytical requirements. The revised MRP, incorporating the requested revisions, with Regional Board modifications, is attached. General WDR Order No. R4-2002-0030, issued on October 15, 2002, continues to apply.
