TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT—G & M OIL COMPANY, INC., STATION NO. 57, 4346 E. IMPERIAL HIGHWAY, LYNWOOD, CALIFORNIA (CAG834001, CI—8562)

The subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2002-0125, *General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Treated Groundwater and Other Wastewaters from Investigation and/or Cleanup of Petroleum Fuel-Contaminated Sites to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

On May 31, 2007, you submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) Form and the analytical results of representative groundwater samples from your facility to continue enrollment under the General NPDES permit. Board staff has determined that the groundwater discharge from your facility is more appropriately regulated under General NPDES Permit No. CAG994004, Order No. R4-2003-0111, adopted by this Board on August 7, 2003.

On August 15, 2007, NPDES Permit No. CAG994004, Order No. R4-2003-0111 with a revised Monitoring and Reporting Program was issued to G & M Oil Company, Inc. for the discharge of groundwater from the cleanup project into the Los Angeles River. Since the existing permit has been superseded by Order No. R4-2003-0111, coverage under NPDES Permit No. CAG834001, Order No. R4-2002-0125 for the subject facility is hereby terminated, except for enforcement purposes.

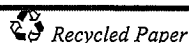

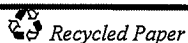
