TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT – SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY, HYDROSTATIC TEST – PEBBLY BEACH GENERATING STATION, CATALINA ISLAND, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG674001, CI-8659)

In our letter dated October 16, 2004, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under *General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Hydrostatic Test Water to Surface Waters in the Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

We have received and reviewed your letter dated May 26, 2004, where in you informed this Regional Board that the hydrostatic testing of the 120,000 gallon diesel fuel storage tank and all associated piping system was completed in January 2004 and discharge of hydrostatic test water has ceased. Accordingly, you requested the subject permit to be terminated.

Since General NPDES Permit No. CAG674001 is no longer needed for the subject project, coverage under Board Order No. 97-047 is hereby terminated, except for enforcement purposes.
