GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SMALL COMMERCIAL SUBSURFACE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS – MINT CANYON MOBILE MANOR, 16408 SIERRA HIGHWAY, CANYON COUNTRY, CALIFORNIA (FILE NO. 02-067, CI-8675)

We have completed our review of your application for coverage under Waste Discharge Requirements to discharge domestic wastewater from Mint Canyon Mobile Manor in the Canyon Country area.

Mr. Benjamin H. Smith (hereinafter Discharger) owns and operates a mobile home park commonly known as Mint Canyon Mobile Manor (Facility) located at 16408 Sierra Highway in Canyon Country, California. The Facility is located in the Eastern Santa Clara/Santa Clara-Mint Canyon Groundwater basin at longitude: 118°25'12", and latitude: 34°27'00".

The Facility is approximately four acres in size and has 49 residents. The Facility includes 27 mobile homes, which were developed in two phases. The first phase was developed in 1961 for thirteen mobile home spaces. The second phase was developed in 1964 for an additional fourteen mobile home spaces. The Facility is located in an unsewered area of Canyon Country in the vicinity of the City of Santa Clarita. The nearest sewer collection system is approximately one and a half miles from the Facility.

Domestic wastewater at the Facility is treated by two on-site 2,500 gallon septic tanks and discharged to six seepage pits. The average wastewater volume from the Facility is approximately 5,200 gallons per day. The sizes and depths of the seepage pits are unknown. Two fifty (50) foot percolation pits and one sixty (60) foot exploration boring were drilled at the site on January 13 and 14, 2003. Based on the results of the drilling, there was no evidence of groundwater observed in the 60-foot boring. According to Los Angeles County hydrologic records, the groundwater in the area is approximately 90 feet below ground surface.

Regional Board staff have reviewed the information provided and have determined that the proposed discharge meets the conditions specified in Order No. 01-031, "General Waste Discharge Requirements for Small Commercial and Multifamily Residential Subsurface Sewage Disposal System," adopted by this Regional Board on February 22, 2001.
