**TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
– PPG INDUSTRIES, INC. AT 465 CRENSHAW BOULEVARD, TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA
(ORDER NO. R4-2002-0030, SERIES NO. 053, CI-8815, UST FILE NO. 905030170)**

In our letter dated October 29, 2004, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2002-0030, Series No. 053, which also serves as your Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR).

By letter dated May 28, 2008, you notified the Regional Board that In-situ Chemical Oxidation for remediation of total petroleum hydrocarbons performed for the site is complete and that you request rescission of the WDR.

The monitoring results were provided to the Regional Board in the *First Quarter 2008 Groundwater Monitoring Report*. The Regional Board has granted the site closure on November 18, 2008. Since the In-situ Chemical Oxidation has been completed, and the WDR is no longer needed, the coverage under Board Order No. R4-2002-0030, Series No. 053 for the subject facility is hereby terminated.
