TERMINATION OF COVERAGE UNDER GENERAL NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS—CITY OF LOS ANGELES, AVENUE 45 AND ARROYO DRIVE RELIEF SEWER PROJECT, S. AVENUE 60 & ARROYO DRIVE, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CAG994004, CI-9389)

In our letter dated March 28, 2008, we informed you that the subject discharge is regulated under Order No. R4-2003-0111, *Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Groundwater from Construction and Project Dewatering to Surface Waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties*, adopted by this Board on August 7, 2003, which also serves as your NPDES permit.

We have reviewed your June 16, 2009, letter requesting termination of your coverage under the General Permit. The letter indicated that you have directed your discharge to the sewer system.

On July 9, 2009, Board staff inspected the project site and verified that there is no discharge of groundwater from the site to surface waters. Since there is no discharge of groundwater from the site, coverage under the Board Order No. R4-2003-0111, General NPDES Permit No. CAG994004, for the subject site is hereby terminated except for enforcement purposes.

Please note that if future discharges of groundwater to surface waters become necessary, you must file a Report of Waste Discharge with this office and obtain appropriate Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs).
