

If application of pesticides ceases and the permit is no longer needed, please submit written notification to the Regional Board so that you will not be billed for future annual fees.

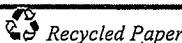
