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NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY; GENERAL SECTION 401 WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION ORDER REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, EA: 01-0J930U - TWIN LAKES CAPM PROJECT (WDID#5A17CR00200), LAKE COUNTY

On 4 June 2025, Caltrans (Applicant) filed a notification requesting coverage under the 25 February 2022 State Water Resources Control Board Clean Water Act Section 401 General Water Quality Certification and Order of the United States Army Corps of Engineers 2021 Nationwide Permits (General Certification Order) for the EA: 01-0J930U - Twin Lakes CAPM Project (Project). After review of the notification and the supplemental material submitted by the Applicant, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) has determined that the Project qualifies for enrollment under this General Certification Order. The proposed activity will take place within 0.0073 acre/97 linear feet of waters of the United States.

The Central Valley Water Board is certifying this Project under United States Army Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit #3a (Maintenance Activities), subject to the conditions and the notification requirements described in the Nationwide Permit ("Special Conditions"). This Notice of Applicability is being issued under the General Certification Order pursuant to Section 3838 of the California Code of Regulations.

The Project must proceed in accordance with the requirements contained in this Notice of Applicability and General Certification Order. The Project is described in the notification form requesting coverage under the General Certification Order, dated 4 June 2025, and supplementary information (Application Package). Coverage under the General Certification Order is no longer valid if the Project (as described) is modified.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The 61.5-acre EA: **01-0J930U - TWIN LAKES CAPM PROJECT** (Project) consists of rehabilitating pavement using the following strategies: dig outs, profile grinding, and placing 0.20 feet of Rubberized Hot Mix Asphalt gap graded (RHMA-G) overlay. Impacts to Harris Creek include culvert replacement with an upsized culvert and installation of a flared end section at the outlet.

The Project will temporarily impact 0.0047 acre/80 linear feet of stream channel and 0.002 acre/10 linear feet of riparian zone. The Project will permanently impact 0.00059 acre/7 linear feet of stream channel.

PROJECT LOCATION:

The Project is located in Lake County on State Route 29 from postmile 11.89 to 23.60.

PROJECT SCHEDULE:

15 June 2026 through 1 December 2026.

APPLICATION FEE RECEIVED:

An application fee of \$4,212.00 was received on 27 June 2025.

The fee amount was determined as required by California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 3833(b)(3) and 2200(a)(3), and was calculated as category E - Low Impact Discharges (fee code 87) with the dredge and fill fee calculator.

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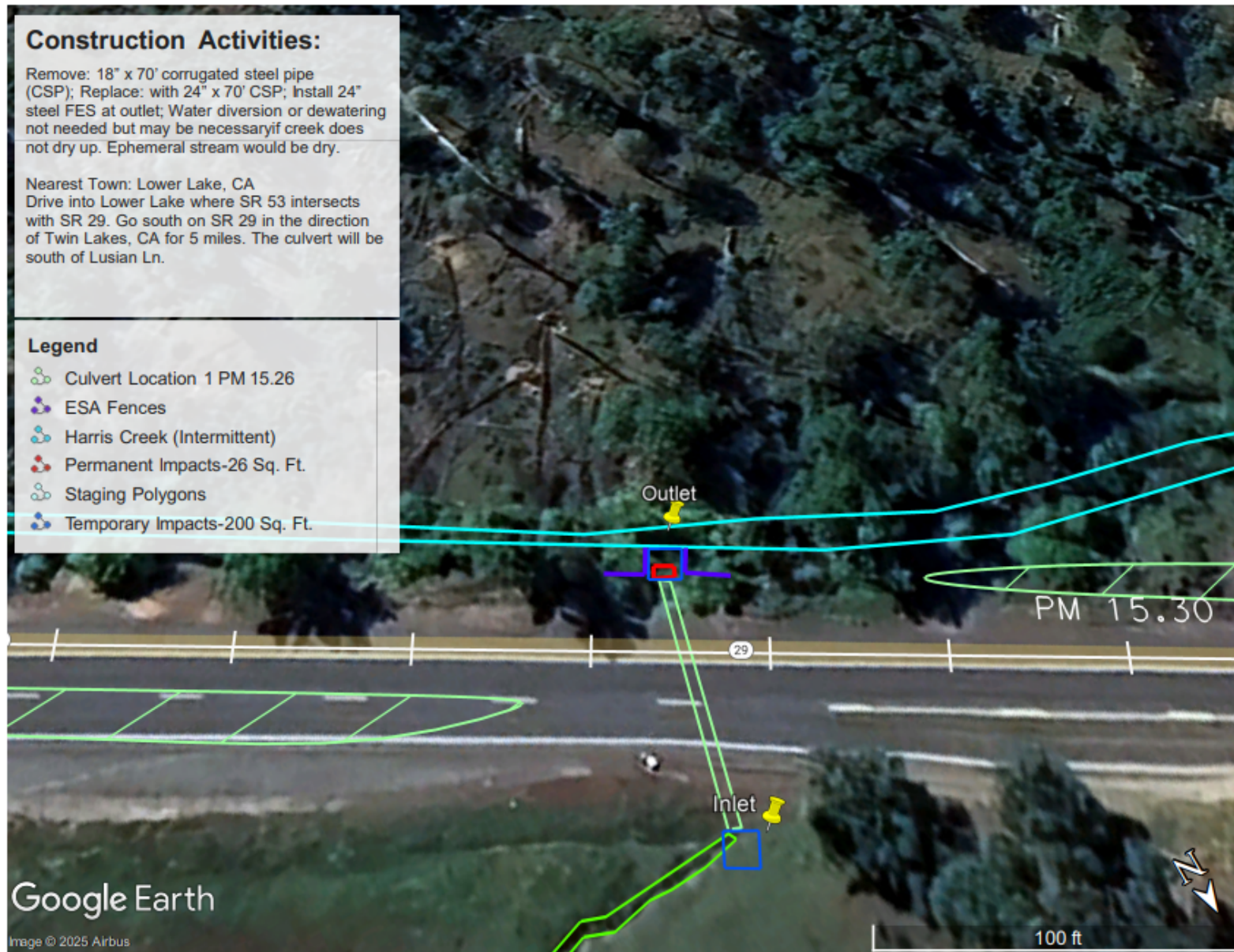


Figure 1: Aquatic Resources Impact Map
