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NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY FOR COVERAGE UNDER ORDER NO. 2004-0004-DWQ, STATEWIDE GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR DREDGED OR FILL DISCHARGES TO WATERS DEEMED BY THE U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS TO BE OUTSIDE OF FEDERAL JURISDICTION, LAWSON RESIDENCE PROJECT (WDID#5A31CR00611), PLACER COUNTY

On 4 February 2025, Clayton Lawson submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) to enroll under and comply with State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) Order No. 2004-0004-DWQ, Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Dredged or Fill Discharges to Waters Deemed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers to be Outside of Federal Jurisdiction.

The Central Valley Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) has reviewed your enrollment materials and finds the Lawson Residence Project (Project) meets the requirements of, and is hereby enrolled under, Order No. 2004-0004-DWQ. You may proceed with your Project in accordance with the Order.

Please familiarize yourself with the requirements of Order No. 2004-0004-DWQ. You are responsible for complying with all applicable Order requirements. Failure to comply with Order No. 2004-0004-DWQ constitutes a violation of the California Water Code and may result in enforcement action or termination of enrollment under the Order.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The 2.8-acre Project consists of developing a private residence on the Project site. Project elements that affect aquatic resources include filling and relocating a 180 linear foot seasonal wetland swale. Approximately 1,000 cubic yards of clean native fill will be imported to the site to fill a section of the swale when the swale is naturally dry. A swale will be created outside of the impact area by excavating a new swale that ties into the existing swale to maintain hydrologic connection of the feature.

The Project will permanently impact 0.01 acre/180 linear feet of seasonal wetland swale.

PROJECT LOCATION:

The Project is located at 3420 N Lakeshore Blvd., Loomis, CA 95650. The approximate center of the Project area is located at latitude 38.8243489°N and longitude -121.1097115°W.

PROJECT SCHEDULE:

April 2025 through April 2027

APPLICATION FEE RECEIVED:

\$4,212.00 was received on 5 February 2025. The fee amount was determined as required by California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 3833(b)(3) and 2200(a)(3) and was calculated as category E - Low Impact Discharges (fee code 87) with the dredge and fill fee calculator.

ADDITIONAL CONDITION:

The Applicant shall obtain coverage under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Construction and Land Disturbance Activities Order No. 2009-0009-DWQ, as amended for discharges to surface waters comprised of storm water associated with construction activity, including, but not limited to, demolition, clearing, grading, excavations, and other land disturbance activities of one or more acres, or where projects disturb less than one acre but are part of a larger common plan of development that in total disturbs one or more acres.

COMPENSATORY MITIGATION:

Compensatory mitigation is not required since the swale will be realigned and will not result in a loss of waters of the state.

TERMINATION OF COVERAGE:

Upon completion of the Project, you shall submit a complete Notice of Termination (NOT) requesting to be un-enrolled under Order No. 2004-0004-DWQ. Attachment 2 to the Order contains the NOT form.

ANNUAL FEES:

This Notice of Applicability is subject to annual billing based on the fee schedule in effect at the time of billing. Annual billing will continue until the Project, including monitoring, is complete and the Central Valley Water Board receives an acceptable NOT. Invoices are usually sent out at the end of each calendar year.

To stop annual billing, the Permittee must submit a NOT from the Central Valley Water Board. Central Valley Water Board staff will verify if the conditions of the Order are met and may conduct a site visit to confirm compliance.




Figure 2: Project Design
