NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
concerning

TENTATIVE REVISED WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR
COUNTY OF LAKE PUBLIC SERVICES DEPARTMENT
EASTLAKE SANITARY LANDFILL
LAKE COUNTY

Revised Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) are tentatively being issued to County of Lake Public Services Department (Discharger) as the operator and owner of the Eastlake Sanitary Landfill (Facility), located on the eastern edge of Clearlake at 16015 Davis Road, Clearlake, in Lake County.

The Facility consists of Class III non-hazardous solids waste management units (landfill) and a non-hazardous liquids waste management Class II surface impoundment. The site also includes entrance facilities, scales, roadways, storage areas, soil borrow areas, maintenance areas, perimeter stormwater management features, landfill gas control features, and other miscellaneous operational areas.

The current WDRs Order R5-2019-0009 is being revised to incorporate an approved lateral and vertical expansion of the Facility, which will increase disposal capacity of the landfill by approximately 1.93 million cubic yards and extend the landfill site life by at least 22 years. The County filed a California Environmental Quality Act Notice of Determination for the Facility expansion with the California Office of Planning and Research (State Clearinghouse Number 2020010546) on 12 June 2020.

This revised WDRs Order is accompanied by a separately issued Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) Order for the Facility.

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 04 March 2024**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

The Tentative Permit was issued for a 30-day public comment period on **02 February 2024** and comments are due by **5:00 p.m. on 04 March 2024**. Written evidence or comments submitted after **5:00 p.m. on 04 March 2024** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Board Chair. Any person requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
