TELL US WHAT YOU THINK POTENTIAL CAMPGROUND SITES 8.25 acres; located 0.95 mi from connection to Bike Master Plan and Transit along existing multi-use trail system. SAN DIEGO BAY 12.75 acres: located 0.8 mi west of Hollister Street, Direct access to existing sewer, multi-use trail system, and vehicular access from Monument Road. IMPERIAL BEACH 26.00 acres; located 1 mi west of Hollister Street on disturbed habitat. Direct access to existing sewer, multi-use trail system, and vehicular access from Monument Road 17.75 acres; located on the west and north sides of Spooner's Mesa. Unobstructed views of Coronado Islands, Tijuana Slough, Silver Strand and San Diego Bay, and Downtown San Diego. NATIONAL WILDLIFE 26.6 acres; located on north and east sides of Spooner's Mesa with direct views of Downtown east across Otay. Direct access to regional trail system, however 0.68 miles of existing roadway would need to be improved to provide access and avoid impacts to DHS operations. No access from east or connection to East Mesa without return to Monument Road. SANDAG MINGATION BIRDING PONDS TIJUANA RIVER NATIONAL ESTUARINE DAIRY MART PONDS RESEARCH RESERVE 7.12 acres; existing infrastructure including parking, roadway, and gate facilities. Direct access to regional trail system with unobstructed views along the coast. BUTTERFLY & BIRD & GARDEN / STAGING Joint development with CA State Parks and CBP would be necessary. 

- Border Field State Park total of 7.12 acres


