Consistent with State Water Resources Control Board regulations that apply to this proceeding, written comments received after 5:00 p.m. on January 13, 2020 will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party except at the discretion of the Chair in accordance with section 648.4, title 23 of the California Code of Regulations (CCRs).
