CHRONOLOGY: 1989 - Revision of Site Cleanup Requirements for Sunnyvale

Landfill

DISCUSSION: The purpose of the Tentative Order (Appendix A) is to update Waste

Discharge Requirements for the Santa Clara All Purpose Landfill, which is no longer accepting municipal waste but continues to accept

minor amounts of dredged materials and biosolids.

The landfill accepted municipal waste from the 1920's through 1993. Approximately 11 million cubic yards of waste material was placed into the landfill. Monitoring indicates that waste and landfill leachate

is contained within the landfill.

The Tentative Order updates tasks necessary to insure continued containment of waste and leachate. Tasks including landfill monitoring and maintenance, implementation of stormwater controls, and submittal of written reports describing any proposed changes in site use or conditions which may affect water quality at the landfill.

We have circulated the Tentative Order to the discharger and interested parties. The discharger has provided minor comments, which have been incorporated into the Tentative Order (Appendix

B).
