SUBJECT: Dublin San Ramon Services District, Dedicated Land Disposal Site, Class II

Land Treatment Unit, Pleasanton, Alameda County – New Waste Discharge

Requirements (WDRs)

CHRONOLOGY: No prior board actions have been taken for this site

DISCUSSION: The Revised Tentative Order (Appendix A) establishes WDRs for the Dedicated

Land Disposal Site (DLD). The Revised Tentative Order includes requirements necessary to insure that the DLD is properly maintained and monitored so as to prevent water quality impacts, and to maintain compliance with Title 27 and the

Water Code.

The DLD, located in Pleasanton, is a 55 acre site utilized for disposing biosolids generated from the Dublin San Ramon Services District wastewater treatment plant. The biosolids, which are generated as a byproduct of sewage treatment, are transported from the treatment plant and placed into furrows in the DLD and immediately covered with soil. The DLD is required to be extensively monitored to ensure that water quality impacts do not occur.

The Revised Tentative Order includes requirements for installation of additional monitoring wells, implementation of a monitoring and maintenance program, and submittal of technical reports necessary to protect water quality and demonstrate compliance with the requirements of the Order.

The original tentative order, after circulation to the Discharger and interested parties, was revised as appropriate, based on the comments provided by the Discharger (Appendix B). The Discharger has indicated acceptance of the Revised Tentative Order.
