**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR
RESCISSION OF CEASE AND DESIST ORDER**

**Sanitary District No. 5 of Marin County
Tiburon Wastewater Treatment Plant
2101 Paradise Drive, Tiburon, CA 94920, Marin County**

Sanitary District No. 5 of Marin County owns the Tiburon Wastewater Treatment Plant and collection system. The plant has a current dry weather design capacity of 0.98 million gallons per day and provides secondary treatment of municipal wastewater that is discharged through a submerged outfall to Central San Francisco Bay. The San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) issued a cease and desist order to ensure compliance with its discharge permit. Regional Water Board staff has prepared a tentative order for this discharger to rescind this enforcement order because the discharger has demonstrated that it can now comply with its permit.

The Regional Water Board intends to consider adopting the tentative rescission order during a meeting to commence at the time and location as follows:

The deadline for comment is 5:00 p.m. on March 12, 2009. Comments must be sent to the **attention of Robert Schlipf**. Persons wishing to file written comments on or objections to the tentative rescission order, or other aspects of this matter must do so no later than this deadline so that such comments may be considered. No written comments will be accepted or responded to in writing if received after that deadline. Interested persons are invited to attend and express their views at the public hearing on this matter. The Regional Water Board will hear oral testimony, but will not accept written comments after the deadline noted above.

Pursuant to section 2050(c) of Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, any party that challenges the Water Board's action on this matter through a petition to the State Water Resources Control Board under Water Code section 13320 will be limited to raising only those substantive issues or objections that were raised before the Regional Water Board at the public hearing or in timely submitted written correspondence delivered to the Regional Water Board.

The tentative order, comments received, and related documents may be inspected and copied at the Regional Water Board office.
