TENTATIVE RESOLUTION

THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD CONGRATULATES SAVE THE BAY ON ITS 50TH ANNIVERSARY AND RECOGNIZES ITS SERVICE AND COMMITMENT TO PROTECTING, RESTORING AND CELEBRATING SAN FRANCISCO BAY

- 1. Save The Bay is a grass roots environmental organization in the San Francisco Bay Region established in 1961 to protect San Francisco Bay and associated baylands (Bay) from unnecessary fill and pollution, as well as opening up the Bay shoreline to public access; and

- 3. The Bay is the largest estuary on the Pacific Coast and serves as one of California's important ecological habitats supporting endangered species as well as sustaining hundreds of aquatic and wildlife species; and

- 5. The Bay is home to several commercial ports, including but not limited to, the ports of San Francisco, Oakland, Redwood City and Richmond, which are integral to the economic vitality of the San Francisco Bay Region, State, and the United States; and
- 6. Organizations such as Save The Bay are essential for the protection, promotion, and enhancement of public trust resources, such as the Bay, for the benefit of current and future generations; and
- 7. This year, Save The Bay celebrates its 50th anniversary and five decades of achievements and accomplishments in protecting, preserving, and celebrating the environmental integrity of the Bay.

Therefore, Be It Resolved that the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, congratulates Save The Bay on its 50th anniversary and commends its service and commitment to protecting, promoting and celebrating the San Francisco Bay.
