**Proposed Settlement and Stipulated Order for Administrative Civil Liability**

**California Department of Transportation**  
**Route 84 Bear Gulch Creek Discharge**  
**Woodside, San Mateo County**

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, Prosecution Team and California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) have entered into a proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Order. The proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Order impose an administrative civil liability against Caltrans in the amount of \$13,200 for an alleged discharge of approximately 2,346 gallons of chlorinated water into Bear Gulch Creek in Woodside, San Mateo County.

Persons may comment on the proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Order by submitting written comments no later than 5:00 p.m. on July 19, 2012. The Executive Officer will adopt the Order if no significant comments are received by the deadline above. If significant comments are received, a hearing before the Water Board may be scheduled.
