CLARA COUNTY - Adoption of New Waste Discharge Requirements and

Rescission of Resolution No. 70-22

CHRONOLOGY: March 1970 - Resolution adopted prescribing requirements for waste discharge

DISCUSSION: The attached Tentative Order (Appendix A) would rescind Resolution No. 70-22

for the Martin Park Landfill in San Jose, recognize and approve the landfill's 2007 Post-Closure Land Use Plan, establish requirements for the anticipated development of the site as a soccer field with related park amenities, and bring the landfill into compliance with the appropriate regulations that govern final

capping of landfills.

The site was originally used as a clay borrow pit for brick and clay pipe manufacturing from the 1940s until 1970. In 1970, G&M Construction Company purchased the site for use as a construction debris disposal site. The site accepted debris until 1974, when the landfill was reportedly closed and

capped, then sold to the City of San Jose.

The City of San Jose has indicated acceptance of the Tentative Order and did not

submit any comments. We expect it will remain uncontested.
