NOTICE OF PROPOSED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND STIPULATED ORDER in the matter of SONOMA VALLEY COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT SONOMA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (Water Board) Prosecution Team and Sonoma Valley County Sanitation District (Discharger) have entered into a proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Order. The proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Order impose an administrative civil liability against the Discharger in the amount of \$732,300 for unauthorized discharges to waters of the United States.

This proposed liability is for alleged violations of the Clean Water Act Section 301 and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for 46 sanitary sewer overflows totaling approximately 425,000 gallons to waters of the United States from August 1, 2010, to January 31, 2015. The proposed liability also includes a mandatory minimum penalty for an alleged violation of the NPDES permit residual chlorine discharge limit from the Discharger's treatment plant on November 13, 2014.

The proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Order proposes that up to \$365,000 of the total liability may be applied towards two supplemental environmental projects. One project involves \$50,000 to incentivize replacement or repair of defective private sewer laterals. The other involves \$315,000 to stabilize the banks at Ash Creek to reduce erosion and sediment discharges.
