Dear Mr. Kifle,

I am very pleased to provide a letter of support for California State Park Foundation's efforts to secure mitigation funding as part of the above referenced settlement to benefit educational programming and capital improvements at Candlestick Point State Recreation Area (CPSRA), Yosemite Slough.

My history with Candlestick Point State Park and the desire to ensure that it become a "jewel" of the state park system with innovative public environmental programs in a safe and family-friendly atmosphere dates back more than four decades when I was legislative staff to newly-elected Assemblyman Art Agnos. The first bill that he introduced as a legislator, AB1, required that the park be built as California's first Urban State Recreation Area. The intent was to restore the shoreline to its natural state, preserve the Bay, wetlands and other natural resources and, to provide inner city residents who might not have the means to travel to far flung State Parks with the opportunity to experience the natural habitat of the diverse San Francisco Bay.

The opening of the new interpretive center, infrastructure, trails and visitor amenities along the north shoreline of Yosemite Slough will be instrumental in connecting more than 200,000 annual visitors with the park's unique ecology and wildlife, as well as the area's Native American, industrial, cultural, and environmental justice history. In addition to providing visitors with a greater sense of place, the new park improvements will create a more welcoming, community-oriented environment, providing outdoor and indoor space for community gatherings, nonprofit programming partners, volunteer events and, K-12 school groups and environmental education programming. Most importantly, these efforts will help strengthen ongoing local involvement with a key, urban state park as well as champion the need for the preservation of San Francisco Bay, shoreline habitats and open space.

I urge your support of California State Parks Foundation and their plans to build a new education center at CPSRA along with other planned improvements at the highest possible level. Thank you for your consideration.
