**NOTICE OF
OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT**

REVISED TENTATIVE CLEANUP AND ABATEMENT ORDER

The San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) staff prepared a revised tentative cleanup and abatement order (Revised Tentative CAO) on February 13, 2017. The Revised Tentative CAO alleges that Timothy Starkweather, Jean A. Porlier, Joan L. Boblitt, Robert Vidalin, and William Vidalin (collectively, the Dischargers) are responsible for unauthorized discharges of fill placed into wetlands and proposes that the Dischargers clean up and abate the effects of the unauthorized fill. The alleged fill activities occurred at Alameda County Assessor Parcel Numbers 902-0008-005-05 and 902-0008-005, located at Los Colinas Road, Livermore.

The tentative cleanup and abatement order was revised in response to the comments received during the initial public noticing from January 13 to January 23, 2017. Two additional owners of the property, William Vidalin and Robert Vidalin, were named as responsible parties.

The Regional Water Board is providing a 10-day comment period to allow comments on the Amended Tentative CAO. **The deadline for submitting written comments is 5:00 p.m. on March 20, 2017.** Comments must be sent to the attention of Yan Nusinovich. Comments received after the deadline or on any subject other than the Revised Tentative CAO will not be considered. Comments already submitted are included in the record for this proceeding and do not need to be resubmitted.

A party may challenge the Regional Water Board's action on this matter through a petition to the State Water Board, as described in Water Code section 13320. Pursuant to Title 23 of California Code of Regulations section 2050(c), any party who petitions the decision will be limited to raising only those substantive issues or objections that were raised before the Regional Water Board at the public meeting or in timely written correspondence submitted to the Regional Water Board as described above.
