Board staff has prepared a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System general permit for groundwater treatment facilities in accordance with the Clean Water Act and Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act.

The permit covers discharges associated with the extraction and treatment of groundwater impacted by VOCs, fuel leaks, fuel additives, and other related wastes in the San Francisco Bay region.

The deadline for receipt of comment on the draft permit is 5:00 p.m. on September 11, 2017. Comments must be sent to the attention of Marcos De la Cruz. Persons wishing to file written comments on any aspect of this matter must do so no later than this deadline so that such comments may be considered.

The Board will consider adopting the draft permit during a meeting to commence at 9:00 a.m. on **November 8, 2017**, in the Auditorium at 1515 Clay Street in Oakland. Interested persons are invited to attend and express their views at this hearing.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 23 section 2050(c), any party who challenges the Board's action through a petition to the State Water Resources Control Board under Water Code section 13320 will be limited to raising only those substantive issues that were raised before the Board at the hearing or in timely submitted correspondence.
