NOTICE OF PROPOSED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND STIPULATED ORDER
in the matter of
SUPER STORE INDUSTRIES
VIOLATIONS OF THE INDUSTRIAL STORMWATER GENERAL PERMIT
SOLANO COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (Water Board) Prosecution Team and Super Store Industries (Discharger) have entered into a proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Order (proposed settlement order). The proposed settlement order imposes an administrative civil liability against the Discharger in the amount of \$230,000 for alleged violations of the General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activities, Order No. 2014-0057-DWQ, National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System No. CAS000001 (General Permit).

This proposed liability is based on allegations that the Discharger violated a best management practice requirement of the General Permit, which allegedly resulted in a prohibited discharge to Jameson Canyon Creek.

The proposed settlement would allow \$115,000 to be suspended pending a Supplemental Environmental project to fund the San Francisco Bay Regional Monitoring Program, specifically toward the Napa River and Sonoma Creek Sediment Transport Monitoring Study.
