NOTICE OF PROPOSED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND STIPULATED ORDER in the matter of

LIVERMORE-AMADOR VALLEY WATER MANAGEMENT AGENCY UNAUTHORIZED DISCHARGE OF 21.7 MILLION GALLONS OF FULLY TREATED AND DECHLORINATED WASTEWATER TO SAN LORENZO CREEK PLEASANTON, ALAMEDA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (Water Board) Prosecution Team and the Livermore-Amador Valley Water Management Agency (Settling Respondent) have entered into a proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulated Order (proposed settlement order). The proposed settlement order imposes an administrative civil liability against the Settling Respondent in the amount of \$30,000 for an alleged unauthorized discharge of secondary treated and dechlorinated wastewater to waters of the United States.

The proposed liability is based on allegations that the Settling Respondent violated Discharge Prohibitions III.B and III.E of its NPDES Permit, Order No. R2-2016-0015, on March 10, 2018, until March 12, 2018.

The proposed settlement would allow \$15,000 to be suspended pending completion of a supplemental environmental project (SEP). The SEP would involve funding the Regional Monitoring Program, care of the San Francisco Estuary Institute, which would allow the Regional Monitoring Program to monitor polychlorinated biphenyls loads in stormwater in the San Leandro Bay watershed between October 1, 2018, and March 31, 2020.
