NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT AND PUBLIC HEARING FOR DISCHARGE PERMIT

Rodeo Sanitary District, Water Pollution Control Facility 800 San Pablo Avenue, Rodeo, Contra Costa County

Board staff has prepared a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit for the above discharger in accordance with the Clean Water Act and Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act.

The Rodeo Sanitary District owns and operates a wastewater treatment plant and the collection systems of Rodeo and Tormey, which are unincorporated areas of Contra Costa County. The plant provides secondary treatment of domestic and commercial wastewater from its service area, serving a population of about 10,500 people. The plant discharges an average of about 0.54 million gallons per day of treated wastewater to San Pablo Bay.

The deadline for receipt of comment on the draft permit is **5:00 p.m. on November 9, 2022**. Comments must be sent to the **attention of Samuel Plummer**. Persons wishing to file written comments on any aspect of this matter must do so no later than this deadline so that such comments may be considered.

The Board will consider adopting the draft permit during a meeting to commence at 9:00 a.m. on **December 14, 2022**. Interested persons are invited to express their views at this hearing.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 23 section 2050(c), any party who challenges the Board's action through a petition to the State Water Resources Control Board under Water Code section 13320 will be limited to raising only those substantive issues that were raised before the Board at the hearing or in timely submitted correspondence.
