NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT AND PUBLIC HEARING FOR

PROPOSED WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR EAST BAY REGIONAL PARK DISTRICT'S REGIONAL MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES IN ALAMEDA AND CONTRA COSTA COUNTIES

NOTICE IS HERBY GIVEN THAT the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (Water Board) will accept written comments on the Tentative Order for issuing Water Quality Certification and Waste Discharge Requirements for the East Bay Regional Park District's (District's) Regional Maintenance Activities in Alameda and Contra Costa counties.

The Tentative Order would replace Order No. R2-2018-0036, issued to the District for regional maintenance activities conducted pursuant to an approved manual for maintenance activities. Order No. R2-2018-036 has expired and the Tentative Order will allow the District to continue implementing regional maintenance activities.
