NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT AND PUBLIC HEARING FOR DISCHARGE PERMIT

Phillips 66 Company, Rodeo Renewable Energy Complex 1380 San Pablo Avenue, City of Rodeo, Contra Costa County

Board staff has prepared a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit for the above discharger in accordance with the Clean Water Act and Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act.

Phillips 66 Company owns and operates the Rodeo Renewable Energy Complex, formerly the San Francisco Refinery, which used to process about 84,000 barrels of crude oil per day. The Facility has transitioned to processing only renewable feedstocks (cropbased oils, rendered fats, and other biological oils) and may process up to 80,000 barrels per day into renewable diesel, components for blending with other fuels, and fuel gas. This will result in discharge of a projected 2.0 million gallons per day of treated wastewater to San Pablo Bay. The Facility also discharges once-through cooling water and stormwater to San Pablo Bay.

The deadline for receipt of comment on the draft permit is **5:00 p.m. on May 8, 2024**. Comments must be sent to the **attention of John Madigan**. Persons wishing to file written comments on any aspect of this matter must do so no later than this deadline so that such comments may be considered.

The Board will consider adopting the draft permit during a meeting to commence at 9:00 a.m. on **June 12, 2024**. Interested persons are invited to express their views during this hearing.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations Title 23 section 2050(c), any party who challenges the Board's action through a petition to the State Water Resources Control Board under Water Code section 13320 will be limited to raising only those substantive issues that were raised before the Board at the hearing or in timely submitted correspondence.
