2024 Dr. Teng-chung Wu Pollution Prevention Award – Presentation of Award to NapaSan

DISCUSSION

This item is the presentation of the 2024 Dr. Teng-chung Wu Pollution Prevention Award to NapaSan in recognition of its exemplary pollution prevention public outreach and education program. NapaSan's program includes an innovative and funny podcast called "Going with the Flow," an annual open house at its Soscol Water Recycling Facility, and a multi-day citizens' academy, which educates adult community members about wastewater treatment and pollution prevention. In recent years, following the cancellation of in-person events due to the COVID-19 pandemic, NapaSan has been proactive about bringing back a full schedule of in-person plant tours for school groups and the community. Pollution prevention messaging and education is a core component of NapaSan's tours and educational events. Stephanie Turnipseed, NapaSan's Public Information and Outreach Specialist and an active participant in the Bay Area Pollution Prevention Group, leads this creative outreach strategy.

The Board established the Dr. Teng-chung Wu Pollution Prevention Award in 2007 to honor the legacy of Dr. Wu, who worked for many years at the Board and was an early visionary in pollution prevention. He believed the best way to keep the Bay clean was to keep pollutants from entering wastewater, rather than constructing expensive treatment works to remove them. The spirit of Dr. Wu's belief remains critical today as we face incentives to reuse wastewater and biosolids, which is contingent on the pollutants that are in them. The annual award in his name recognizes innovation, effectiveness, and collaboration in pollution prevention.
