<u>Item *7. General Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Waste from</u> <u>Inert Waste Disposal Facilities (IWDFs) Within the Santa Ana Region</u> –

The Santa Ana Water Board will consider the adoption of General Waste Discharge Requirements establishing minimum standards for waste acceptance, facility management, site maintenance, and monitoring and reporting at IWDFs within the Santa Ana Region. The Order will ensure that IWDFs do not degrade water quality or cause nuisance conditions and will provide consistency for regulation of IWDFs within the Santa Ana Region under a uniform set of waste discharge requirements.

Item *8. Waste Discharge Requirements for Richland Developers, Inc., Tract 16072 Residential Development Project, San Bernardino County –

The Santa Ana Water Board will consider adoption of Waste Discharge Requirements authorizing the discharge of fill material to non-federal waters of the state for the construction of a residential development consisting of 358 singlefamily homes with associated infrastructure, roads and recreational trials. The construction of the residential development would result in the permanent physical loss of 5.21 acres streambed.
