NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR IN-SITU REMEDIATION OF GROUNDWATER AT THE JAMES SQUARE FACILITY CORONA DEL MAR, ORANGE COUNTY

TENTATIVE ORDER R8-2024-0049

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board (Santa Ana Water Board) is releasing for public review and comment tentative Order R8-2024-00049 (Tentative Order), which will serve as Waste Discharge Requirements for the discharge of chemical amendments into the subsurface at the James Square facility (2929 – 2939 East Coast Highway, Corona Del Mar) to promote remediation of groundwater impacted by volatile organic compounds (VOCs) within the specified treatment zone (in-situ). With proper management and monitoring as required by the Tentative Order and associated Monitoring and Reporting Program, any potential adverse effects will be localized, of short duration, and are not expected to unreasonably impair any existing or prospective beneficial uses of groundwater. The Santa Ana Water Board intends to consider adopting the Tentative Order during a public hearing at a regularly scheduled Santa Ana Water Board meeting as follows:

Interested persons may attend and express their views orally on this matter at the public hearing. Oral statements should be brief to allow all interested persons time to be heard. Such comments will generally be limited to three minutes, though the Board Chair may grant additional time on a case-by-case basis.

The Santa Ana Water Board's agenda for the Board meeting will be available on the Santa Ana Water Board's <u>Agenda</u> webpage at least ten days prior to the meeting. Please check the Santa Ana Water Board's website for the most up-to-date public hearing date and location, as they are subject to change.

SUBMISSION OF WRITTEN COMMENTS

The Santa Ana Water Board will accept written comments on the Tentative Order during a 30-day public comment period. Persons wishing to submit written comments on the Tentative Order are requested to do so as soon as possible, but comments must be received no later than 5:00 pm on July 24, 2024.
