and October 1, 6, 9 & 10, 2025.

and will be held by **Zoom Webinar** except the hearing on May 19, which will be
conducted in **hybrid format (in person and by Zoom)**. Representatives of parties will

PURPOSE OF HEARING

The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board or Board) Administrative Hearings Office (AHO) is conducting a public hearing about the Delta Conveyance Project. The purpose of the hearing is to gather evidence that the State Water Board will consider to determine whether to approve change petitions filed by the Department of Water Resources (DWR or Petitioner) to add two new points of diversion and rediversion to water right Permits 16478, 16479, 16481, and 16482 (Applications 5630, 14443, 14445A, and 17512, respectively) (SWP Permits) and, if so, terms and conditions the Board should include in the amended permits.

BACKGROUND

On February 22, 2024, the State Water Board's Division of Water Rights (Division) received petitions for change from DWR to add two new points of diversion and points of rediversion to water right Permits 16478, 16479, 16481, and 16482, which are associated with the State Water Project (SWP). The proposed new points of diversion and points of rediversion would consist of screened intakes 2.3 miles apart located on the lower Sacramento River between Freeport and Sutter Slough. The proposed new intakes are part of the Delta Conveyance Project, which would allow DWR to divert water from the Sacramento River in the northern portion of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Estuary (Delta) and convey the water through a tunnel to existing water distribution facilities in the southern Delta. A more detailed description of the Delta Conveyance Project and the associated petitions for change can be found in the July 31, 2024 Notice of Public Hearing.

AHO PROCEEDING

The AHO issued a Notice of Public Hearing on July 31, 2024, and Amended Hearing Notices on November 18, 2024, and on January 17, February 28, and April 4, 2025. The AHO held pre-hearing conferences on August 13, October 17, and December 16, 2024. The AHO began the public hearing on February 18 with the presentation of oral policy statements by interested persons and entities, and discussion of outstanding procedural issues. After being interrupted on March 24, the hearing continued on April 3, with the Petitioner's presentation of case-in-chief testimony. The hearing is being conducted in accordance with the procedural requirements in the July 31, 2024 Notice of Public Hearing as amended by subsequent rulings and notices.

ADDITIONAL HEARING DATES

The AHO has scheduled additional hearing dates on May 21 through 23, and May 27 and 28, 2025, for presentation of DWR's case-in-chief witnesses.

POLICY STATEMENTS

The AHO and members of the Board will hear policy statements from interested members of the public on **May 19, 2025**. This portion of the hearing continues the presentation of policy statements that began on February 18 and were interrupted on March 24. (2025-03-25 Statement on Public Hearing Incident.) As reflected in the July 31 Notice of Hearing, each oral policy statement or oral summary of written policy

statements shall not exceed 5 minutes. The hearing officer may impose a shorter time limit based on the number of interested persons who request to make an oral presentation.

Members of the public who wish to present a policy statement may do so in person or may join remotely using Zoom. Members of the public may also listen to and watch the proceeding in person or on YouTube at bit.ly/aho-youtube.

During the presentation of policy statements, the hearing officer will invite those who are present in person at the physical location of the hearing to speak first. Then, the hearing officer will invite those appearing on the Zoom platform to present their policy statements or summaries of written policy statements.

How to Present a Policy Statement in Person:

Interested members of the public who wish to present a policy statement in person are requested, but not required, to register using the Registration Form <https://forms.office.com/g/2ZQhiQwJYb> and indicate an intent to present a statement in person. The hearing will begin at 9 a.m. at the Joe Serna Jr. CalEPA Building, Byron Sher Hearing Room, 1001 I Street, Second Floor, Sacramento, California. How to Present a Policy Statement Using Zoom Webinar:

The AHO, in coordination with the Water Board's Division of Information Technology, has implemented new security procedures to ensure a safer and more secure virtual hearing space. These new security procedures have been in place since April 1, 2025, are effective at maintaining a secure space, and will minimize the risk of any future disruption.

Advance registration is necessary to participate in the hearing by Zoom Webinar on May 19. Filing a Notice of Intent form is not necessary to participate in this proceeding under these new procedures.

- To register, anyone who intends to present a policy statement should complete the Registration Form at <https://forms.office.com/g/2ZQhiQwJYb> by the close of business on **Thursday, May 15, 2025**.
- The AHO will send an individualized link to join the webinar to each interested person who has completed the Registration Form **at approximately 8:00 a.m. on Monday, May 19**. This link is specific to the registered person and e-mail address and should not be shared with other users. The same link cannot be used to access the hearing on more than one device.
- If you registered for the proceeding and have not found your individual link to join the hearing before the start of the hearing at 9 a.m., please check your junk and spam mail folders. If you did not receive an individualized link or need other technical assistance, please e-mail DCP-WR-Petition@waterboards.ca.gov.

- To join the hearing on May 19, please click the “Join” link in the personalized e-mail from Zoom. Please consider signing in early to allow time to address any technical issues.
- Each interested person will enter the proceeding as an “Attendee.” Attendees will be able to see and hear video tiles of the hearing officer in the hearing room and other AHO staff, but will not be able to turn on their own camera or microphone features when the proceeding begins.
- The hearing officer will call the name of each interested person who has registered for the hearing when it is that person’s turn to speak. When the hearing officer calls your name, please raise a virtual “Zoom” hand to help AHO staff. The Zoom application may present a pop-up window asking for agreement to be elevated to a “Panelist.” AHO staff will then elevate you to a “Panelist” to present your policy statement. There may be a short pause while the system elevates you. You are not being disconnected. After you finish your statement, AHO staff will return you to Attendee status, and the hearing officer will call the name of the next speaker. After you have presented your policy statement, please exit the Zoom Webinar. You may observe the remainder of the hearing using the YouTube livestream.
